A native of Bavaria, J. Hanno Deiler was the originator of the archives for the history of the Germans in the South, which is now the Deutsches Haus. A well-known author in the United States and Germany, his historical research was chiefly related to the Germans in the United States, particularly Louisiana. The Deiler Papers include typescripts of some of Deiler's works, draft and final versions of Deiler's writings concerning Germans in the Southeastern United States, research notes, genealogical material on prominent Louisiana German families and *Annals of the Germans of New Orleans* for the years 1842-52, 1858 and 1860.
