Henri de Ste-Gême was born at the Château de Bagen in the parish of Sauveterre, near St Gaudens in the Province of Languedoc, in south-west of France (nowadays in the village of Sauveterre-de-Comminges, in the département of Haute-Garonne). As a nobleman, he was eligible for membership in the Garde du Corps of the Comte d'Artois, brother of Louis XVI and future Charles X. He joined the group and is said to have emigrated with Artois in 1790. This presents a problem, however, since the future king fled his brother's palace at Versailles on the night of 16 July 1789. Whatever the case, Ste-Gême made his peace with the French Revolution, serving in the Republican armies. In time he was sent to Saint Domingue. In the Comte d'Artois' carriage at the time of the flight he was the Prince d'Hénin's chief gentleman in waiting. The Prince is not to be confused with the General d'Hénin, mentioned in several documents in the collection, who was Ste-Gême's commanding officer for a time in Saint Domingue. There were two generals on the island by that name, Etienne Félix d'Hénin de Cuvillers (1755-1841) and François Nivard Charles Joseph d'Hénin (1771-1847), both of whom did stints on Saint Domingue while Henri de Ste-Gême was there.

While still in Saint Domingue, Ste-Gême became involved in privateering in the Caribbean Sea. As Paul Lachance has written, he "had invested heavily in privateering expeditions." In 1809, he came to New Orleans, bought a sugar plantation in what is now Gentilly, and served in the Louisiana Militia, commanding an elite unit known as the Dragons à Pied. As a major, he served under General Andrew Jackson at the Battle of New Orleans and received a commendation. Jackson liked the "salty little French rooster," who was all of five feet tall and who wore an enormous plume in his cap, perhaps to enhance his small stature. Growing and refining sugar was not Ste-Gême's only source of revenue, it should be noted. In Louisiana he continued his privateering ventures and was very involved financially in the activities of Jean and Pierre Lafitte. He married Marguerite Delmas, the widow of Louis Geoffroy Dreux, and returned with her to France in 1818, where he lived until his death. His plantation overseer and manager

continued to handle his affairs and wrote him newsy letters detailing life in New Orleans.

The papers in the Ste-Gême Collection contain correspondence to Henri de Ste-Gême and his son Anatole in Bagen, France, from Ste-Gême's plantation overseer, Jean Boze (1818-36), and manager, Auvignac Dorville (1818-73) in Gentilly. The correspondence concerns Ste-Gême's affairs in Louisiana, with descriptions of sugar manufacturing along with detailed accounts of New Orleans social life, people, and events. The collection also includes personal military papers from service in Saint Domingue and the Louisiana Militia (1802-16); financial papers concerning the Ste-Gême property holdings, rents, and revenues in Louisiana (1845-1900); extracts from legal papers having to do with the seizure of the ship *Massena* during a period of Franco-Spanish difficulties (1808-21); and New Orleans newspaper clippings enclosed in letters from Boze (1830-37).

regrets being unable to pay his debt to
Ste-Gême, and comments on the marriage of
Aussenac.

Ste-Gême's lawyer will refute this by pointing out that Lara didn't inform his own government of dealings with an "enemy of his country." Also, he has news of Boucher, living in Paris.

to Mr. Ste-Gême, apologizing for not coming

illness. He promises to pray for his trip,

- Folder 21 **1818 Apr. 20** Boze, New Orleans, to Mr. Ste-
Gême, St-Gaudens, [France]. Boze discusses

two cases involving ownership of slaves.
Dr. Miguel Ulloa is trying to counteract
gossip spread by Pepe Lara. Boze has been
ill. Dumas promises to pay his debt if his

helping Dorville with the succession of M.
J. Bte. Causse. Dorville will send Ste-
Gême sugar. He opened letters to Ste-Gême
from friends and relatives in France.
Dorville includes news of several
acquaintances.

- Folder 25 **1818 Oct. 7** Auvignac Dorville, Gentilly, to Mr. Ste-Gême, St-Gaudens, Department of the Haute Garonne. He has had to dispel rumors of Ste-Gême's death. He discusses a dispute over ownership of two slaves involving Adeline Renaud and M. Dupuys, the leasing of Ste-Gême's houses and other personal financial matters, the food and other items he is sending Ste-Gême, and rabbit hunting. The letter includes a section dictated by M. Lambert.

He asks that Ste-Gême burn the letter enclosed in this one after reading it.

Boze has news of M. Bouché. Boze will return to Cuba with M. Thibaut. He needs the deed to the property Ste-Gême gave his natural children. M. Chaubaud will sell Laurent, a slave, by judicial action. New Orleans has been "drowned in snow." The slave Zaïre was handed over to Ste-Gême's agents. Boze lists current commodity prices.

- Folder 31 **1819 Apr. 8** Boze, New Orleans, to Ste-Gême.
Boze asks for Ste-Gême's power of attorney
so he can see to the matters of Pepe Lara
and of the schooner Masséna, instead of
using a third party.

- Folder 32 **1819 Apr. 17** Auvignac Dorville, Gentilly, to
Mr. Ste-Gême, St-Gaudens, Haute Garonne.
Dorville reports that Boze is leaving for

Louisiana; "money is not circulating."
Dominique Rouquette went bankrupt and
killed himself. Dorville asks Ste-Gême to
send him instructions about financial
matters.

comments on the rumor that Spain will sell
Cuba to England, the "splendid receptions"
given Gen. Jackson, and the possibility of
buying M. Cagnol's property. Dominique
Rouquette has gone bankrupt and drowned
himself; Boze describes the effect on his
creditors. He lists those who have died or
are leaving the city. The banks have
stopped discounting, so business is poor.
Also, Fr. Kuhn is in disgrace.

- Folder 35 **1819 May 3** Boze, to Mr. Henri de Ste-Gême, St-Gaudens. Letter includes additional note written on envelope and another on a small piece of paper. Boze lists recent deaths, and tells of the rebuilding of the theater. Cadet Mouton is hiding a mulatto who committed murder. Boze tells of the fate of Gen. Lallemand's expedition, and of the financial situation of the boarding school he managed.

He mentions "the Chevalier ladies" and says Clémentine is fond of Ste-Gême. Dorville has had no news of Boze in Cuba.

- Folder 40 **1819 Aug. 31** Auvignac Dorville, Gentilly, to Mr. Ste-Gême, St-Gaudens. Dorville sends Ste-Gême his books showing income from Ste-Gême's properties. Dorville is having trouble collecting the debts owed Ste-Gême. He suggests repaying what is owed M. Dreux. Colas has died. The slaves are doing well. Also mentioned are M. Destoup, M. Salles, and M. Ribon.

- Folder 41 **1820 Mar. 11** Auvignac Dorville, Gentilly, to Mr. Ste-Gême. Dorville discusses Ste-Gême's agricultural income. He describes the illness of Nérisse, so Ste-Gême can consult a doctor. The slave Amazilie's baby has died; the other slaves are in good health. Dorville admires Ste-Gême's children. Mme Dreux is going to France. M. Dreux needs his \$2000. Dorville also mentions the many bankruptcies, Zaïre's progress, the probable hanging of Lafarge and 15 other pirates, prohibitions on hunting on plantations, and the deaths of M. Hazeur and M. Fortier.

- Folder 42 **1820 May 28** Auvignac Dorville, Gentilly, to Mr. Ste-Gême. Dorville sends his condolences. He suggests Ste-Gême return soon to prevent the seizure of the slave Laurent. Also, Ste-Gême's house is "going to ruin." Dorville discusses financial matters, including rents collected and a debt paid M. Dreux. He encloses letters for the family, and via M. Latapie, is sending contraband bitters. He sends detailed news about the slaves. He has been unable to sell the silver tureens. Two of the pirates have been hanged.

- Folder 46 **1820 Nov. 12** Ch[arle]s D'Aubevie Dutillet, New Orleans, to Henri de Ste-Gême, St-Gaudens, Haute Garonne. Dutillet says business is bad, then lists those who have died of yellow fever. He sends greetings to Ste-Gême's family.

- Folder 47 **1821 Jan. 15** Boze, Santiago de Cuba, to Mr. Ste-Gême, St-Gaudens, containing general news. A second copy of the letter is also contained within the folder. Boze is waiting for the Governor to be replaced before taking action against Pepe Lara. In the matter of Laurent, the mortgaged slave, Boze agreed to terms with J. B. Causse's executors, but not his children. Boze also mentions the fortune made by Jacques Bonne in the slave trade. The second copy has some differences, including another postscript about the maritime suit.

- Folder 48 **1821 Feb. 5** Auvignac Dorville, Gentilly, to Mr. Ste-Gême. Dorville discusses Boze's efforts to reclaim Ste-Gême's maritime property and his work in settling the suit resulting from the Causse succession. He goes over financial matters such as the debt paid M. Dreux. Dorville is on bad terms with his neighbor Hopkins. He gives details about the state of the plantation, particularly the slaves. He is considering building himself a new house. He summarizes a letter from Mme Dreux. He hopes Ste-Gême returns to New Orleans.

- Folder 49 **1821 Mar. 15** Boze, Santiago, Cuba, to Mr. Ste-Gême, St-Gaudens, on sending all the documents necessary for Ste-Gême to reclaim his confiscated maritime property, with details of which ships they are on, and which ports they will go through. Boze explains the settlement he made on Ste-Gême's behalf with Pepe Lara. He also mentions M. Cadet Moulon, "the hypocrite Grantmond," and their creditors. ALS, 3 p., French. 1 item.
- 1821 Apr. 4** A note on sending duplicate documents of maritime properties to France. The papers have been addressed to Mr. Lafonta and are traveling on the French brig Valentine. Mention is made about sending mail at other times on other ships.
- Folder 50 **1821 Mar. 24** Two copies of a letter from Auvignac Dorville, Gentilly, to Mr. Ste-Gême, St-Gaudens Haute Garonne. Dorville encloses a draft of \$1665 or 8325 francs, drawn by M. Boumage on M. Courtois, and explains the details of the transaction. He goes over recent plantation business, including the loss of a third of the orange crop and generally low prices. He also mentions M. Dupuis and the plantation's slaves. With a copy containing slightly different wording. ALS, 2 p., French. 2 items.
- Folder 51 **1821 May 6** Boze, Santiago, Cuba, to Mr. Henri de Ste-Gême, St-Gaudens. Boze asks Ste-Gême to write if he has received the documents of maritime properties and the settlement with Pepe Lara, so Boze can leave Cuba. M. Causse's heirs have vetoed a settlement concerning the slave Laurent. M. St-Macarty is getting rich in the slave trade; Boze advises Ste-Gême to collect his debt. Boze also writes about the foolishness of Michel Milan, who is sailing on a ship flying the Spanish flag, carrying a third of his fortune, despite the pirates near the coast. from Boze concerning the Causse settlement.
He also mentions M. Dreux, Mme Morant or
Morand, and Clementine.

Boze brought José de Lara before the

the meantime, payments should be returned
to Lara. Boze sends instructions for
sending him the needed documents. Boze has
decided to prosecute M. Vt. Dallest for a
debt owed Ste-Gême. He has reached a
settlement regarding the Causse succession.

- Folder 55 **1821 Dec. 25** Two copies of a letter from Boze, Santiago, Cuba, to Mr. Henri de Ste-Gême, St-Gaudens. Boze explains that he has sent two sets of documents on different ships, in case of pirates. He discusses his efforts to locate M. René Laporte and to collect Mme Marguerite Laforgue's debt from M. Joseph Thomas; why he hasn't used M. Canbine's letter for the Governor; the settlement with the Causse succession; various financial matters, including his legal battles with José de Lara and M. Dallest; news of the Widow Tessier's family; etc.

- Folder 56 **1822 Feb. 4** Auvignac Dorville, Gentilly, to Mr. Ste-Gême, mentions the cost of building a brick or wooden house and the unusual rainy weather from June to September, which caused difficulties on the plantation. Also informs him of new adornments to New Orleans streets, and of the "sun stroke on [his] head" in July, from which he has recovered. The slaves are in good health.

In answer to Ste-Gême's reproach, he tells "the truth of the matter" about Adeline's seizing of two slaves, one belonging to Brouard, and the other, Anna, belonging to Adèle.

Also in the folder is a list of the possessions of the physician, Romain, when he lived in Saint Domingue. Romain owned one-third of the Denis Plantation and two coffee plantations Le Grands Bois and Rouzan.

Folder 727 **n.d.** Deposition given by Jean François Henri, Baron de Ste-Gême, concerning the ownership and improvements made by Jean Pierre Tardos to the Chitri and Jumecourt plantations. Note is made that Tardos was forced to give up everything when the French army withdrew to Santiago de Cuba.

Folder 728 **n.d.** Five folded papers used to label papers, three notes and an envelope used to house papers.

Of the five folded papers one is marked notes given in France to Ste-Gême for seeking out the persons and their places of residence if alive or their estates if deceased, lists the names of nine individuals. The others are labeled as follows: research note concerning the succession of the late Dominique Cartet, with note attached; research note of the succession of the late Baptiste Baradal; research note on the succession of the late Jean Guillem; and accounting provided by Bouché as he paid for the grain that had been sold to him and delivered.

Note on Baptiste Baradal questioning if Rouville is the executor of his estate and if Marie Petit is his niece. There is a paper with information on the estate of Sabarros. Note concerning Boucher and securities being sent to different individuals.

Envelope marked, "concerning inquires made by Ste-Gême about persons in Saint Domingue and New Orleans.

- Folder 730 **n.d.** Broadside for a factory which deals in the restoring of old cloth. The advertisement bears a one-centime stamp.

- Folder 731 **ca. 1830** News clipping from *L'Abeille*, dated 14 June 1830, of a letter to the editor concerning a piece published by the *Argus*, in which the editor combined a personal concern and election matters. Underneath is printed the results of the elections of several officers of the Artillery Battalion.
News clipping from *L'Abeille*, dated 19 June 1830, pertaining to the United States Congress passing of a bill intended to cut the duty on molasses in half and a bill expelling Indians from the lands inhabited by their ancestors under the pretext that these lands are in the confines of the states and territories.
News clipping from an unknown source on the celebration of the anniversary of 8 January 1815, in the city of New Orleans.
Clipping of the death notice for William M`Ferlane Saul, cashier at the Orleans Bank. Source unknown.

- Folder 732 **ca. 1830** Four news clippings. One is a notice for the finding of the body of Mr. Simpson, who having murdered his wife stabbed himself and jumped in the river.
Two of the clippings concern the death and burial of Captain Dominique You. Noted in one of the clippings is that the government of the City of New Orleans paid for his funeral arrangements.
News clipping possibly from the *Courrier*, pertaining to the city's July Fourth celebrations.

Folder 733 **ca. 1831** Two news clippings one from *L'Argus*, dated 11 November 1831, which deals with how the city council is handling matters of vital importance to the Vieux Carré and Faubourg Marigny. Cited in the article is a proposal by Soulé to put lots close to Jackson Square up for sale.

The other clipping is from an unknown source and deals with the city government's treatment of the Faubourg Ste-Marie versus the city proper and lower faubourgs.

Folder 734 **ca. 1833** Seven news clippings, one of which is on the House of Representatives vote to allow the importation of slaves and repeal all laws opposed to this importation. There is a clipping on the city's acceptance of the bronze mask of Napoleon from Dr. Antommarchi. Another deals with the murder of Delphin Villeré by Descoteaux. There is a clipping addressed to Etienne Mazureau, public prosecutor, about his use of personal attacks. Statistics on deaths due to cholera in Havana from 24 February-20 March 1833, using only those buried in the general cemetery, is the subject of another of the clippings. A clipping dated 1 May deals with the falsehood of the cholera rumor going around New Orleans. The clipping from *Le Courrier*, dated 4 April 1833 is concerned with the cholera epidemic in Havana, Cuba and mentions the death of United States Consul, Schaler, formerly a businessman of New Orleans.

Folder 735 **ca. 1834** Two clippings, one from *L'Abeille* and the other from *Le Courrier*, dealing with the especially cold weather and ice and noting the damage to the orange and sugar cane crops, are attached to a piece of scrape paper.

Clipping of the speech given by Preau at the celebration marking the anniversary of 8 January.

News clipping on the counterfeiting activities of Antoine Foucher, Jr. containing commentary on the likely hood of his not being prosecuted given that he belongs to an old respectable family.

News clipping dated 17 May 1834 concerning the fire at Martin Gordon's Royal Street store and residence. Fire did damage to two barrels of brandy and seems to have been an act of arson.

Folder 736 **ca. 1834** Four news clippings, one of which is the death notice for Jean Gravier, a native of Bergerac, France, Gravier had amassed a great fortune and was the owner of the land that made up the Faubourg Ste-Marie but envy, deceit and trickery combined to wipe him out and he died in a state not far from poverty.

News clipping on the city council meeting held on 28 June 1834 which contains a letter by the Mayor and letters by H. Pédesclaux, President of the Church Wardens, St. Louis Church. All three letters deal with the fact that the churchwardens will no longer assume the responsibility for burying the dead and cemeteries run by the Church Wardens will only accept bodies that are supposed to be placed in tombs in those cemeteries.

News clipping concerning the general interest in buying land from Evariste Blanc for the city's new cemetery. The article states Blanc's land is too expensive and adding to the cost will be the need for landfill at the site and flood protection.

Clipping dated 11 August deals with the Mayor informing the City Council that he purchased the land of Evariste Blanc to create a cemetery. Also noted in this clipping is a discussion about building a road along Girod Canal, lined by two rows of trees, leading directly to the cemetery. Another part of this clipping concerns the first gaslight experiment

conducted in the City. The experiment was a success.

Folder 737 1835

Clipping taken from *Le Courrier*, dated 21 April 1835 which contains three stories. One is the announcement of Bernard Marigny as a candidate for the Representative seat left vacant by the death of Antonio Ducros. The second is a notice inviting Democrats of the city to gather at the Richardson Stock Exchange on Conti Street to make the necessary arrangements for a dinner to honor Col. Th. H. Benton. The third item relates the unfortunate accident between the Poursine family pirogue and the steamboat *Belfast* on the Mississippi River in the vicinity of Donaldson. Mr. Casimir, William Pursine, a three-year old child and Mr. Landry all lost their lives. Madame Poursinen was saved by the silk dress she was wearing at the time which kept her afloat.

Clipping taken from *Le Courrier* and dated 4 May 1835 which has the announcement of Bernard Marigny as a candidate for Representative and a note that the mail train from the North has brought no news from beyond Mobile. Also part of this clipping is that the City Council ordinance authorizing the Mayor to deed to the United States corporation's rights to the ownership of Jackson Square received that magistrate's sanction and that shortly the Mint ordered erected by Congress should be built on this square. Dr. Formento's horse and buggy accident and the murder of Mr. Déraut are also mentioned in this clipping.

News clipping taken from *Le Courrier* dated 28 July 1835, which relates the death of George Clarkson at the hands of Alexander J. Wood.

Handwritten on this clipping is, "Observations from the newspaper *Le Franc Parleur*." It consists of four separated sentences. Two mention Mr. Caldwell, one concerns the Fourth of July and the other

notes he is entertaining the public with the farce *Le Maire en herbe*. there is one that pertains to Marigny having repeated the words "fellow citizens" 13 times in a speech and the other concerns a candidates credentials to be Mayor.

Two copies of a *Le Courier* clipping dated 29 July 1835 which is an extract from the Port Gibson correspondent dated 18 July and relates the story of a conspiracy by slaves and a band of thieves and incendiaries; how they were found out and how the conspirators were tried in secret and hung.

Folder 738 **1835-1836** Clipping from *Le Courier* dated 11 August 1835 which contains four news items. One is that the *S.A. Austin*, has reached New Orleans from in eleven days from Vera Cruz. The second is a report on a meeting held at Banks Arcade for the purpose of adopting and recommending to the slave states measures to prevent the propagation of the doctrines of the northern abolitionist societies. The third news item concerns Tennessee's election for Governor and the fourth is a thought on the United States paying the indemnity due the American citizens and that we send France word that we should not let a dispute over a disbursement that is still due dishonor ourselves or freedom.

Clipping from *L'Abeille* dated 14 August 1835 which contains six different news items. The first is an announcement that the City Council will consider the proposal brought to it by the Desbordes estate and owners of property on the river in Faubourg Ste-Marie. The second concerns a false rumor that the *Orléans* was lost at sea. A notice of newspapers and mail received from vessels makes up the third news item. The fourth is a piece on the Louisiana Legion. A report on the troubles between Indians and whites over the Creek territory in Georgia is the focus of one of the news items. This sixth news item

concerns the relationship between Mexico and Texas and the revolt against Santa Ana that is forming.

Article on a duel which took place in the neighborhood of Ohio between a Navy Lieutenant and three individuals taken from the Cincinnati *Evening Post* and given the dated September 1835.

Article from the 3 September 1835 copy of *Le Franc Parleur* on an attempted uprising in New Orleans against mechanics. The article questions if the uprising was truly aimed at shutting slave laborers out of their workrooms.

News clipping of a story originally run in the *Pensacola Gazette*, entitled, "The Field of Death" which describes the scene found by troops under the command of General Gaines when they came upon the spot six miles north of the Withlacoochee River where the Indians ambushed the men under the command of Major Dade and Captain Prazer.

Clipping from an article on an act which deals with the introduction of slaves into the state. Missing from this clipping is the beginning and the end of the article. On the reverse side is an advertisement noting that Druggist J. Michinard has a new address and the Mr. Guillaume is taking charge of his restaurant starting 20 October.

Folder 739 **1836-1837** Six news clippings taken from various papers. There is a clipping labeled 31 July 1836 from *L'Echo de la Louisiane* formerly *Le Franc Parleur*, relating how Dr. Léger who charged with committing bigamy was shot leaving the court room by the son of his victim.
Clipping labeled as from *L'Echo de la Louisiane*, 10 August 1836. The news story is titled, "Monument to 8 January 1815" and concerns C. G. de Armas' proposal accepted by the City Council for a monument in memory of 8 January 1815. The article takes issue with de Armas' French method of

financing the monument.

Clipping taken from *L'Echo de la Louisiane* for 10 August 1836, on the designs used by architects in New Orleans who seem to go for the colossal when New Orleans possesses neither the soil nor materials for such structures. Uses as examples the Bank of Louisiana and the stock exchange on St. Louis Street. Noted as an exception is City Hall.

Clipping which has been labeled, "taken from *L'Echo de la Louisiane* of 17 August 1836, previously known as *Le Franc Parleur*. Is this true or is it not?" and concerns reports that Madame de Pontalba plans to construct a building inspired by the Palais Royal in Paris on the Place d'Armes.

Clipping from the 13 December 1837 *L'Abeille* on an article on how the state legislature is handling the question of regulating banks. The article praises Senator Hoa of New Orleans for the views he expressed in the debate. A second article which is contained in this clipping is an article on the meeting of the Louisiana Senate held 12 December 1836.

Clipping announcing that Edouard J. Forstall has been appointed President of the Citizens' Bank.

Folder 740 **ca. 1837** Clipping from *L'Abeille* of 12 December 1837 which contains a notice to those with children or relatives at Jefferson College; the announcement that Adolphe Cuvillier was appointed clerk of the Supreme Court; and a note concerning the arrival from Washington of the President's message from the President. The main article in this clipping is concerned with the session of the Louisiana Legislature. Banking practices and what the legislature can do to alleviate the financial woes of people and businesses is the main theme of this article.

Newspaper clipping of an article entitled, "Act to Amend the Charters of the

Banks of this State and other Purposes" from an unknown paper. The article lists the 37 sections of the Act created by the state legislature.

Folder 741 **n.d.** Two envelopes once used to house materials in this collection. One is labeled "Important Documents" and contained letters including the one from Andrew Jackson. The other is labeled, "Various letters etc..." and noted on the front is, "bills to H. F. de Ste-Gême."

Folder 742 **n.d.** Binder casing used to house the letters written in New Orleans by Boze to Baron de Ste-Gême d' Uston at Bagen. Also noted on the cover is that Boze managed the Gentilly property belonging to the Dreux family.
