Workshop Description

Join THNOC's education staff in Rethinking Primary Sources—we'll show you ways to find ready-to-use primary sources in THNOC's catalog, demonstrate the accessibility of digital primary sources, and share insights on how we create curricula that feature a wide range of primary historical sources.

This workshop is intended for current educators who are interested in learning how to do archival research and incorporate primary historical material into their teaching and/or curriculum development. During this day-long program, participants will work one-on-one with THNOC staff to learn the basics of archival research methods and participate in discussion about using primary sources in teaching. This workshop will be limited to four participants.

There is no charge to attend this workshop. The Historic New Orleans Collection will provide breakfast, lunch, and all workshop materials. Parking will not be provided, but participants will be mailed a small stipend after completion of the workshop to cover local transportation costs. Participants will be given a certificate at the end of the day that confirms completion of 7 hours of professional development.

- create and submit a piece of curriculum based on source(s) found at THNOC after the conclusion of the workshop
